## **Autumn Curriculum**

Topic: Toys: Many of your child's lessons will feed into this topic. Below is a synopsis of how the topic will be studied and some opportunities to extend their learning at home.

English	Listening to and discussing a range of poems, stories and non-fiction. Building on their prior phonics knowledge they will practise spelling and writing words, labels, captions and sentences with a focus on letter formation and handwriting.
Mathematics	We will be using a variety of toys and resources to count forwards and backwards, to show place value and ordering. The children will be learning to use and understand $(+ - =)$ symbols and number bonds to 10; applying these to real life problems.

Describe weather associated with these seasons, including day length.</li> <li>Materials: Carry out experiments on different materials, sorting and distinguishing between an object and the material from which it is made. Observing the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials and using data to identify which materials have certain properties.</li> </ul>
Computing History/Geography	Internet safety and Bee Bot programming activities. <b>Toys:</b> The old and the new – Children will learn how toys have changed over

Religious Education	Is everybody special? Should we celebrate Harvest and Christmas?

Art / Design and Technology	The children will be given opportunities to explore art and D/T using a range of techniques, including: mark-making, construction, collage, painting, drawing and junk modelling.
Music	<b>Exploring Sound:</b> We will be using our bodies and voices to make music: singing, chanting and creating rhymes. We will also explore rhythm and beat with a variety of Instruments.
Personal, Social & Health Education	Health & well-being. Recognising & expressing feelings.

## which could enrich your child's learning:

- Reading and writing in different contexts: shopping lists, labels, instructions, books and magazines
- Encouraging children to use their imaginations and be creative in different situations by asking open-ended and thought-provoking questions.

- Count lots of different objects in as many contexts as possible. Ask questions like what is one more/ one less/ how many more do I need? (trips to supermarket, recipes, etc.)
- Encourage independence in everyday routines-can they take responsibility for their book bags, letters, PE kits, homework etc.
