A life skills award for children















## Dear Parents/ Carers

At Hawridge and Cholesbury CE School we already have a big focus on inspiring children to challenge themselves and others, while encouraging them to use a range of learning skills to help strengthen their character. In order to build on our work in this area, we will now be offering to all of our children the Micro, Mini and Junior Duke awards, created by Dawn Waugh of Capable Kids.

The Micro, Mini and Junior Duke give primary-aged children the opportunity to participate in a variety of new experiences. They teach children that it is good to 'have a go' and challenge them to learn new and varied skills from an early age. By enrolling in the award scheme, children will learn that you may not always succeed first time and that is okay. This helps them to develop the resilience they will need throughout their lives.

There are seven levels: Micro Duke (Reception), Silver Mini Duke (Year 1), Gold Mini Duke (Year 2), Bronze Junior Duke (Year 3), Silver Junior Duke (Year 4), Gold Junior Duke (Year 5) and Platinum Junior Duke (Year 6). Each level has a range of ten challenges based around developing valuable life skills such as baking a loaf of bread, fixing a puncture, planning an adventure and making a cup of tea. Children must complete seven of the challenges to achieve the level and be awarded a certificate and a badge.

The Micro, Mini and Junior Duke awards are entirely voluntary and are designed to be completed mainly at home with the support of friends and family. However, a number of challenges will need to be assessed and signed off in school by the class teacher. Children should aim to finish their challenges by the end of the school year.

For those wishing to participate, there is a cost of £10 which includes a challenge booklet, a certificate and a badge (Please note that if your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium then the Pupil Premium grant will cover this cost). The challenge booklet explains the challenges in detail and provides space for written and photographic evidence to be collated. This video explains a little more about the award:
