Spelling – you have finished the book. Well done!

This week I would like you to practise the words Year 1 and 2 children are expected to be spell correctly. We did these at the beginning of the year so it is a recall activity. Please take the first 10 from Year 1 list and the first 10 from the Year 2 list and practise them until you have no problems. Many you will be able to spell with no issues.

<u>Maths</u> – this week we are continuing on with White Rose Maths. Please log on to the website here for the online videos - https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/

The work this week is all about multiplication.

On the second video they talk about arrays. Your child may have forgotten the name of this pattern but we have done this work....I said it helps us to do maths when items are set out logically, rather than in a random group which are harder to count. In class earlier in the year, I showed them photos of a football stadium with rows of seats and columns outside some buildings. We discussed rows going across and columns going up and down and why we would use this method. Use this terminology as it is good maths vocabulary.

If it is helpful get a pack of playing cards and put them face down....your child can organise them into arrays to help them. You can simply do it with pieces of pasta too!
