**Topic:** Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. Much of your child's learning will feed into this topic. We will be considering the following questions as a basis of our learning: Why did they choose to invade and settle in Britain? What was everyday life like during these time periods?

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English	<ul> <li>Writing about characters and extending vocabulary using The Nowhere Emporium by Ross Mackenzie.</li> <li>Identifying and using simile, metaphor and alliteration in poetry.</li> <li>Character description, dialogue and persuasive writing using The Boy at the Back of the Class.</li> <li>Expanding vocabulary using the film Jotun, Journey of a Viking.</li> </ul>
Mathematics	<ul> <li>The focus this term will be on further developing and securing your child's understanding of place value and the four calculation operations.</li> <li>Times tables (up to 12 x 12 will be practiced each week.)</li> </ul>
Science	<ul> <li>Earth and Space: Focusing on our solar system and the movement of the Earth and the other planets relative to the sun.</li> <li>Forces: Exploring the concepts of gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction.</li> </ul>
Computing	<ul> <li>Focusing on the importance of e-safety both in and outside of school</li> <li>Developing word processing and publishing skills.</li> </ul>
History	<ul> <li>Anglo-Saxons and Vikings: Where they came from and the areas that they invaded and settled in.</li> <li>Exploring everyday life during these periods and the influence they had then and on Britain today.</li> </ul>
Religious Education	Our two key questions this term are: 'Do Muslim's need the Qur'an?' and 'Does God communicate with humans?'
PE	<ul><li>Leadership skills</li><li>Invasion Games</li></ul>
Art / DT	<ul> <li>Exploring different mediums to create a Viking ship, using colours and lines to show movement.</li> </ul>
Music	Exploring sources of sound.
PSHE	<ul> <li>Being Me in My World - Who am I and how do I fit?</li> <li>Celebrating Difference -Respect for similarity and difference. Anti-bullying and being unique</li> </ul>
French	Developing communication skills and extending conversational vocabulary

## Possible family visits/ activities which would enrich your child's learning:

- Visit The British Museum, London.
- Visit the library and borrow texts based on Anglo-Saxons and Vikings as well as Earth and Space.
- Visit Chiltern Open Air Museum to discover more about Anglo-Saxons.
