Visitors to our School.

This term we have had a number of visitors. I thought you might like to hear about some of the things they said about our lovely school.

Toby Long (Diocese Adviser) visited at the beginning of this half term and spotted children in Early Years 'supporting one another with phonics during independent work' and children '(particularly boys) were confident to write using phonic knowledge and classroom displays to support.' He also commented on the 'exciting and rich outdoor environment'. In Key Stage 1 he commented on children having a 'purposeful buzz' and was impressed with the use of learning outside.

Lucky Khera (Herts Early Years Advisor) visited at a similar time and commented on the 'interactive displays that reflected current learning' and the creative learning spaces 'to engage children examples include the 'fairy garden', 'mud kitchen' and growing area.'

Marc Boucherat (Herts School Improvement Partner) commented during his visit at the beginning of February on the impact of our FRESH curriculum in boosting and maintaining professional morale, quality learning and engagement and enjoyment of the whole school community.'

Stephanie Hilder (Literacy Consultant) commented on the 'imaginative and engaging use of space and drama to support children with the motivation and material to write' when she visited us in February. She also noticed strong and highly motivating contexts for children to develop writing skills.
