Autumn Curriculum

Topic: Rivers and Mountains This half term the Year 6 pupils will be exploring the physical geography of a river, from its source to the mouth as well as looking at local and national rivers. We are hoping to have a trip to a local river later this half term for hands on fieldwork to take place. In the second half of this term, we move on to mountains and volcanoes. These topics will be linked into our Guided Reading and also our Art.

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English	The children will have opportunities to write in a variety of genres, really focusing on the
	vocabulary and content of their writing. Our aim is to develop these skills alongside the
	essentials of grammar and punctuation. Daily reading for pleasure and in-depth
	comprehension and discussion in guided reading (based on the book 'Wonder' and then
	'Journey to the River Sea') will remain an important focus.
Mathematics	We begin revisiting place value in numbers up to 10 million (including decimals) and rounding.
	Then we will move on to the four number operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and
	division using formal written methods. As always, this will involve times tables practice,
	arithmetic skills together with solving number and practical problems.
Science	We will be investigating Living Things and their Habitats, describing how living things are
	classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and their
	similarities and differences. This topic will include micro-organisms and classifying plants and
	animals. In addition, we shall be reviewing prior learning from Year 5 Life Cycles.
Computing	The children will begin the term looking at e-safety, particularly Cyber-bullying and then in the
	second half term, they will be exploring a range of digital presentation tools.
Religious	We will exploring and reflecting on whether the Saints are encouraging role models in the first
Education	half term and then in Autumn 2, we shall be looking in depth at the Christmas Story and how
	Jesus is portrayed within the gospels.
Physical	Two hours of PE weekly will be split equally between Games and PE. Games will be taught by
Education	a PE specialist. In PE, we will be exploring balance across a range of disciplines such as yoga
	and Pilates.
Art	We will start the term linking with our Rivers topic, exploring Impressionism and the art of
	Monet. Later we will continue with the theme of nature and look at the work of William Morris
	and the Arts & Crafts Movement.
Music	The children will be listening and responding to a modern piece of classical music 'A Bao A
	Qu' composed by Mason Bates.
PSHCE	We will be focusing on the core theme of 'Health and Wellbeing'. This will include how to
	maintain physical, mental and emotional health and wellbeing and healthy lifestyles. We will
	also explore ways of keeping physically and emotionally safe and safe relationships.
French	Across the term, we will be learning to understand basic grammar, vocabulary and how to
	develop simple sentences both orally and written. We will be exploring these in the context of
	where people live, the community and school.

Possible family visits/ activities which would enrich your child's learning:

- Visit local natural habitats, such as woods and rivers
- Look together at the CEOP site for esafety
- Watch out for any relevant documentaries or TV programmes
- Look online for fun information sites on our topic aimed at KS2 pupils

Practical ways to support your child:

- Please encourage your child to read daily, always questioning them about their understanding of the text.
- Ask their opinions about the books and encourage analytical thought and the collection of adventurous vocabulary.
- Make sure home learning tasks are completed well and on time: reinforce learnt concepts or encourage independent research.
- · Keep mental calculation skills sharp.
- Help your child to learn their weekly spellings and practise their times tables.
- Please also ensure that wellies are in school every day as we will continue to spend as much time outside as possible.
