Autumn Term Newsletter No. 1

It has been an absolute pleasure to see our school once again filled with children. It is clear that the children and staff are just as pleased as me to be back to some sort of 'normal'. Thank you so much for all your support, adapting to the new regime and bearing with us as we iron out the creases!

Atishoo! The return of the common cold.

As our community come together after such a long time in separate bubbles it is perhaps not surprising that some of our children and staff are succumbing to the seasonal cold once again. (I had hoped that with all our additional hand washing, working in bubbles and cleaning, the common cold would be eradicated, but it seems not!) The guidance from the government is clear that children or adults do not need to self-isolate if they have a cold with **NO** Covid19 symptoms and in these circumstance should be in school. However, as we are aware colds often come with temperatures and coughs. The guidance from PHE is as follows:

'The presence of a new continuous cough, a temperature of over 37.8 or a change in their sense of taste or smell should trigger self-isolation and testing, regardless of any other symptoms that accompany it.

- The cough must be both new (i.e. not normal for that person) and continuous. The NHS guidance on this is that the person should be coughing frequently for over an hour, or have at least 3 coughing fits in a 24hr period
- The temperature should be confirmed by at least one further reading to eliminate the possibility of thermometer error.'

It is really important that we are all vigilant, test the temperature of unwell children, and apply for a test even if we feel the symptoms are cold-related rather than Covid19.

Covid19 tests

It is rather frustrating to discover that so many people are struggling to book a test at a test site or order a postal test. I am assured that this is being 'escalated nationally' and hope we will see an improvement before too long. In the meantime please do persevere and keep us updated via email to the office. This is creating difficulties for our staff too who do not seem to get any priority testing.

Please be reassured by the fact that we are taking this very seriously, following guidance strictly and being very cautious. We do anticipate that tests and self- isolation will be frequent occurrences within our school community as we make every effort to avoid an outbreak of Covid-19. Current advice is that only the person with symptoms and their household members need to

self-isolate whilst a test is awaited (not contacts at school). If a positive test result is received we will take advice from PHE, Test and Trace accordingly.

This means that staff may be absent from school waiting for tests/ test results for themselves or other household members.

Whilst we do our utmost to keep staff in bubbles, classes may be covered by support staff under the guidance of the class teacher. Where staff are well, but at home, they will be in contact with the class remotely. Clearly if staffing numbers become too low, bubbles may have to close for a short period whilst test results are awaited but we are hoping to avoid that. It will not be manageable for us to inform parents each time a staff member or a pupil has a test, but we will let you know if further action is required on your part.

If your child needs to self-isolate but is well in themselves, the class teacher will work with you to provide the best continuity in learning we can from home. Please let us know if you are in this situation and we will discuss with you a way forward which we hope will work for you, your child and the school.
