Year 4 Residential Visit to Woodrow High House, Amersham
Monday 22nd – Wednesday 24th March 2027

We are excited to inform you that we have booked a three-day residential trip to Woodrow High House in Amersham for Year 4.

The trip will take place from 22nd - 24th March 2027. The visit will cost **£285**. This includes return travel by coach, full board, accommodation for two nights, insurance and a full programme of activities. More details will be shared closer to the date.

We ask that you confirm whether your child will be joining us for the residential trip through a non-refundable deposit of **£85**, which will be required by **21st October 2026**. This deposit must be paid by this date for your child to be secured a place. The complete payment schedule is below and is available on Arbor (with adjustments for PPG children).

Finance should not be a barrier to their child taking part in this trip, but we will require a level of contribution from the year group to be able to run the trip. For your information, families who are entitled to receive free school meals will be contacted regarding a reduced rate.

This trip will provide a great opportunity for our children to develop their teamwork, resilience and perseverance skills whilst having lots of fun and excitement with their friends. We very much hope all the Year 4 children will be able to attend the trip and encourage you to come and talk to us about any concerns you may have.

Residential courses organised by the school are, of course, an optional but invaluable part of the National Curriculum. Pupils benefit hugely from the experience, both educationally and socially, and we feel certain that the programme we have chosen will prove to be both enjoyable and very worthwhile.
