Training (SCITT) working in partnership with Teach First, and our first cohort of trainees have just started their training. Our Insignis SCITT programme, in partnership with Teach First, will lead to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and a PGCE. The one-year, school based, research-led training gives plenty of hands-on experience and allows you to train to teach in an IAT school for the main placement and gain second placement experience at another of our contrasting

schools. Training in our schools also provides opportunities to apply for relevant Early Career Teacher (ECT) roles in all of our schools to further develop your career across our growing Trust.

We have 11 trainees currently training in 3 of our schools across a range of subjects : English, Maths, Science, Geography, Modern Foreign Languages, Religious Studies and Business Studies. We also offer Computing, History Music and PE as well as opportunities in Primary Education from 2025.
